There are too many to list, but we hope that this information sheet will help you when you are talking to your child about what he or she is doing in school.

Mathematics

- complex area and perimeter involving problem-solving
- area of triangles
- volume
- capacity
- multiplying decimals by decimals
- ordering decimals
- improper fractions
- addition and subtraction of fractions
- percentages (including reduction and increase)
- investigating the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages
- extending average and range
- missing number sums
- measuring
- Pie Charts; Venn and Carroll Diagrams

Literacy

- grammar topics - suffixes, independent & subordinate clauses, commas, semi-colons & colons, diminutives, tenses, punctuation and continuation of revising previously learned topics.
- persuasive Writing - advertisements
- creative Writing linked to novel work topics
- thinking and talking about the vocabulary, plot, setting, characters and message of our class novel
- reading and discussing different forms of poetry
- extending our talking and listening skills through debating and discussing relevant topics from the Schools Council, news, novel work and PDMU themes
- learning about and identifying literary devices eg: similes, personification, alliteration, onomatopoeia
- continuing to explore spelling patterns and extend vocabulary through the reading of a wide variety of texts
